#### ■ Young Coders Competition

*Funding for:* Updating the teaching materials and promoting the competition, so that even more children aged 8-13 can learn about coding and the opportunities it presents.

Funded £10,000

#### ■ Cyber Girls First

*Funding for:* Live events designed to attract more girls into computer science and improve the percentage of women in the IT industry.

Funded £5,000

### September

#### ■ Lifelites

*Funding for:* Soundbeam technology - fully inclusive, touch-free musical devices which translate movement into music - to be provided at children's hospices throughout the UK.

Funded £5,000.

#### ■ Age UK London

*Funding for:* Training older Londoners to use digital tools such as e-petitions, online surveys, Zoom and social media in order to campaign for, and become activists in, their communities.

Funded £14,599.

#### ■ The Royal Signals Museum

*Funding for:* A programming and coding module for the museum's educational and outreach programmes, to reflect the increased use of unmanned and autonomous systems in the military.

#### ■ The Oaks Specialist College
