#### ■ National Ugly Mugs (NUM)

*Funding for:* An Application Programming Interface to allow the National Crime Agency and police to safely access its database of harms against sex workers. Also for Artificial Intelligence to code open-text boxes on incident forms.

Funded £15,000

#### ■ The Switch

*Funding for:* The creation of a virtual work experience day for disadvantaged young people in Tower Hamlets, designed to showcase the opportunities and roles available within the tech and IT sector.

Funded £4,520

#### ■ Inside Justice

*Funding for:* A secure, highly encrypted portal for the reporting of miscarriages of justice and secure uploading of digital documents from family or former legal teams.

Funded £2,400

#### ■ FirstLight Trust

*Funding for:* A GDPR compliant database for casework, appointments and impact reporting.

Funded £5,000

#### ■ The Zink Project

*Funding for:* An online referral form to streamline its foodbank and other services and allow for contact outside office hours.
